## Lay-up Rally 2024 - Location, launching, mooring and registration:



The approach to the RWYC is through rather narrow and twisty streets, but experience shows that it is possible to arrive there successfully with a boat on a trailer. The northern approach from Rayrigg Road is the easier. To avoid repeated calls on the steward, please let us know when you expect to arrive, and we will be there to open the gates.

Alternatively, there is a public slipway at Ferry Nab, 15 minutes walk from the RWYC. Lake Wardens' Office, Ferry Nab, 015394 42753, <a href="mailto:lake.wardens@southlakeland.gov.uk">lake.wardens@southlakeland.gov.uk</a>. Boats may also be launched at Fell Foot (National Trust) at the south end of the lake.: 015395 31273, <a href="mailto:fellfootpark@nationaltrust.org.uk">fellfootpark@nationaltrust.org.uk</a>. It will take you around 2 hours to steam up to Bowness.

Mooring for visiting boats will be at the RWYC. Please keep to the jetty specified by the steward on arrival.

Boats must be registered on Windermere. <a href="You do not need to display the large registration numbers so long as your boat is in the current Steamboat Register (on line at the SBA site) and you fly the SBA burgee.</a>
